Methodology & Customer Profile



Methodology



The findings presented in this report are based on an online survey conducted by Innovative Research Group (INNOVATIVE) for Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario.

The survey was conducted a representative sample of n=1879 Ontarians, 18 years or older, between July 25th and August 2nd, 2019.

The main sample has been weighted down to n=1500 by age, gender and region using the latest Statistics Canada Census data, as well respondents views on the importance of education, whether they have children and where in the school system they are, and provincial vote to reflect the actual demographic composition of the adult population residing in Ontario. Targets for the importance of education, where in the school system children are, and provincial vote are taken from a recent telephone survey.


This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels. The margin of error for a random probability sample of 1500 responses is ±2.5% 19 times out of 20.












Regional Segmentation



Note: Respondents are first categorized into 9 Ontario regions based on their postal codes. To have a more meaningful analysis, the 9 regions are further combined into 4 regions: Toronto (Outer Toronto + Centre Toronto), Rest of GTA (the Metro Belts), South/West + South Central), and North/East (East + Central + North).




PC Government on Education | A majority say the government is on the wrong track regardless of whether they have kids in school

[Asked of all respondents, n=1500]






Trust to Protect Students | A majority say they trust teachers more than the government

[Asked of all respondents, n=1500]






Concern with Program Changes | A majority (59%) say they are concerned about changes



How concerned are you about the possibility of changes to the full-day kindergarten program in Ontario? [Asked of all respondents, n=1500]






Importance of Teacher and DECE team | 71% agree the team is important, including 41% who strongly agree

[Asked of all respondents, n=1500]






Need for Teacher's Presence | Three-quarters (76%) agree that there needs to be a teacher in an FDK class
